

Kindergarten Gaps Between Rich and Poor





Standard deviations separating the top- and bottom- income quintile in Kindergarten readiness measures





Components of an Effective Early Literacy Parent Partnership

Access

- Culturally relevant and language-appropriate books
 - Including wordless and bilingual books
- Available consistently from a school or early childcare center

Information

- Training for parents
- Training for Pre-K educators, librarians, and childcare center staff

Partnership

Experience

- School and community-based trainings for parents
- Family literacy events

Extension

 Connect families to school- and library resources to extend home literacy practices beyond program scope

At Work in Wisconsin and Across the US









Through partners/affiliates, RaR operates in 2,900 locations nationally, serving 126,000 children.

Initial cost: approximately \$110 per student.

TSR is a training program for Pre-K teachers. Experimental evidence showed Raising a Reader + Family Nights is an effective augmentation to this program

BCDI is Raising a Reader's sole Wisconsin affiliate, serving approximately 100 Pre-K children in Milwaukee-area

A similar program to RaR (with added training and engagement programs) in the SF Bay Area, serving 14,835 families weekly, with 8,000+ parents, educators, and childcare providers trained in 2017
